Thomas Bullock, Ed.D. completed his undergraduate work at Xavier University in New Orleans, Louisiana and earned a degree in Physics. His graduate work has included engineering at Tulane University, mathematics at Georgetown University, and mathematics at the University of the District of Columbia. Dr. Bullock earned his Education Doctorate in Higher Education Management and Leadership from the University of Pennsylvania.

Among his esteemed accomplishments, Dr. Bullock is a very successful grant writer. He is responsible for more than \$15M in grant funds to the many organizations and programs he belongs to or directs. The success of the programs Dr. Bullock created and directed earned him the prestigious recognition as a *2004 Washingtonian of the Year* by Washingtonian Magazine.

Dr. Bullock was a founding board member of the DC Education Compact, a local education fund that raised an average of \$150M per year to support public education in the District of Columbia Public Schools. He serves as a member of the Board of Directors for several nonprofit organizations including, Whitman-Walker Health, with a \$96M yearly budget, the Heritage Signature Chorale, and the Savannah Technical College Foundation. Dr. Bullock also is the founder and CEO of LEADERS, Inc., a nonprofit organization dedicated to preparing under-resourced undergraduate students for self-reliance, postgraduate opportunities, and leadership through the facilitation of, and exposure to, social and cultural competencies, professional development, and life skills.
